

What support will I get when I arrive?

International Orientation Programme and Airport Pick-up

Our three-day orientation programme is an essential introduction to living and studying in London with opportunities to make new friends, explore the city, take part in social events and attend information sessions. 24/7 support

All students have 24/7 access to UniHelp, our centralised helpdesk. The service can be accessed by phone, email or in person on campus. It's our first port of call for all enquiries. No issues are too big or small for UniHelp – simple enquiries may be answered on the spot, while complex enquiries may be referred to our broad range of specialist teams.

Academic support

Our Learner Development Unit (LDU) will help you get the most from your studies. They're specialists in academic writing, language and numeracy and offer tailored support on any aspect of your studies from writing essays to exam preparation. They also work closely with students who want to develop their English communication skills. We also offer specialist support for students with disabilities, including dyslexia and dyspraxia.

How much will I spend?

How good does my English need to be?

If your education hasn't been conducted in English, you'll need to provide evidence of your English language ability to study with us. We accept a range of English tests, taken within the last two years. For undergraduate study we require IELTS 6.0 (with 5.5 in all components), or equivalent; for postgraduate study IELTS 6.5 (with 6 in all components) or equivalent.

We also offer **pre-sessional English language courses** to students who

need to improve their English level to study with us. Fees for pre-sessional courses depend on the length of course required. To find out more visit www.mdx.ac.uk/preessional

Are there any other entry requirements?

If you are applying for music, art or design programmes you will need to provide a web link to your portfolio.

Will I need a visa?

Where will I live?

Our halls of residence are close by and are a great way to make friends. We have four halls, with prices ranging from £121 - £139* per week. All rooms are single-occupancy and self-catering with wifi. Demand is high, so we encourage you to apply as early as possible if you'd like to live in halls. Alternatively, you may prefer private rented accommodation or private halls of residence, where prices range on average between £85 - £130 per week.
