

Essential Information Guide: Student Regulations 2026/27

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Introduction

1. This document provides you with an overview of Middlesex University's (the University) Student Regulations. Together with the Student Terms and conditions, the regulations govern how we shall deliver education services for you, and the key rights and responsibilities of both you and the University.
2. This Essential Guide is not intended to be a complete statement of the Regulations, but to provide you with an overview of the regulations and regulatory requirements while you are on your academic journey with us.
3. All students enrolled with the University should make themselves familiar with the University's Student Regulations. Each Regulation document will make clear how they relate to students studying at the different campuses of the University and its partners.
4. All students agree to abide by the University Regulations as part of their enrolment. All University Student Regulations are published online.

Academic Regulations

5. These regulations govern your attendance requirements and the ways in which your programme will be assessed. They explain how we will deal with issues of academic misconduct, and how you can make an appeal to us on these issues. Academic Regulations include the following:

Student Conduct Regulations

7. The University expects all students to behave in line with its Student Codes of Conduct and regulations. Disciplinary regulations may apply if you do not do so. This may include incidents which take place as part of your private life, but which have a detrimental impact on your fellow University community members or the University itself.
