FOUNDATION YEAR

Setting you up for success

You may feel that meeting the entry requirements for a degree is a stretch, or you might find the thought of jumping from school or college into university level study daunting. If this is you, then consider a Foundation Year. Many of our degree courses offer the option of a Foundation Year, this is a year of study before you move on to your chosen full degree. Often these are related to a number of different degrees, giving a broad introduction to the subject area.



WORK PLACEMENT

Stand out with employers

Graduates often find it challenging to secure their first job, as many employers look for proven work experience. Gaining practical experience as part of your degree can therefore be invaluable, allowing you to graduate with both an academic qualification and real-world experience on your CV.

Wherever possible, we offer opportunities to undertake work-based learning as part of your degree. This may include a work placement, internship, or other industry-focused experience, varying in length and structure depending on the course.

Degree Apprenticeships

Fees and funding

What will my course cost and what support is available?

Annual fees

If you are a home (UK) student studying a full-time undergraduate degree, the current fee in 2025 is £9,535. The Government has recently announced that from 2026 an annual inflationary increase will apply to fees (subject to Parliamentary approval). Please check our website for up to date fee information.

If you start with a Foundation Year, the Foundation Year fee may be lower depending on your course.

International students pay a higher fee.



Paying for your fees

UK students can apply for a student loan to cover the full cost of fees (subject to meeting the eligibility requirements). The Student Loan Company pays these directly to your chosen university.



Covering your living costs

You can also apply for a maintenance loan to cover your living costs.

The total amount you can borrow will vary by UK country dependent upon whether your home is in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland.



Repaying your loan

You don't start repaying your loan until after you graduate and are earning over £25,000 per year (2025 rate). At that point your payment is deducted from your salary like income tax. The amount you pay back each month depends on how much you earn. See the examples to the right.

Examples of typical monthly repayments as of 2025

Annual salary	Monthly repayment
£24,000	Zero
£26,000	£7.50 (£90/year)
£35,000	£75 (£900/year)



How to apply

Where to apply

All UK student full-time undergraduate course applications are made via UCAS. Head to their website, create an account and then fill in their application online

When to apply

UCAS will open for applications for September 2027 entry, in September 2026. The UCAS equal consideration deadline is in January each year. If you apply by this date your application will be considered equally alongside all other on-time applicants. You can still apply after this subject to courses still having places available.

What you will need

You will need to have two key pieces of information to hand:

The Middlesex University institution code which is M80.

The course code for the course you wish to apply for, you will find this on the course page on our website.

Your offer

We will communicate our offer decision to you directly via email and your applicant account with UCAS. We make two types of offers.

Conditional offer

This means we have offered you a place dependent on you meeting certain conditions. This is most often because you have qualifications you have still got to complete, like A-levels or BTECs. Once these are completed and we have been provided with your results, if you have met our conditions your offer will then be changed to unconditional.

Unconditional offer

This means you meet all the entry requirements for the course and we are offering you a place with no conditions. The place is yours and you just need to accept it via UCAS.

Accepting your offer

Once you have received a decision from all the universities you have applied to, it is time for you to make your decision. You must choose a Firm (first) choice and an Insurance (second) choice. Your Firm choice should be the university and course you most want to go to. There will be a deadline date, set by UCAS, by which you must make your decision.

If you don't make your decision by then and don't update this in your UCAS account you will be rejected by default by all the universities you have applied to, so please make sure you don't miss this deadline.

Next steps

Once you have completed your application form, submit it.

We will review your application and come back to you as quickly as we can. For some courses our decision can be quite quick, but for some there may be additional requirements like an interview or a portfolio review. But don't worry, we will contact you to let you know if this is the case and to make all the necessary arrangements.

We know, this sounds like a lot, but please don't worry.

Take it one step at a time. The University and UCAS will communicate with you throughout the process, advising you what you need to do at each stage and sending reminders where needed. Just remember to keep your eyes open for important emails, make sure you read them carefully, action anything which is needed, keep checking your account with UCAS for updates and take note of any deadlines and make sure you don't miss them.

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And finally, did you know...

As well as our students MDX is home to around 160,000 bees. Bees are such a critical part of world food security, with around 75% of crops dependent upon bees, so these hard workers are a valued part of our community. The apiary, with two hives, is based on the roof of our Grove building and is looked after by the Barnet and District Beekeepers Association. The honey produced is often sold at events on campus.

AI and our prospectus
