

DECLARATION OF KEY INFORMATION FORM

The following information has been provided prior to the selection day for midwifery. Please ensure that you have read and understand what will be expected of you as a student midwife on the Middlesex University Midwifery Programme – including the implications of each of these aspects on this professional programme.

Placements during the midwifery programme will include a range of shifts including early, late, weekends, bank holidays, night shifts and on calls.

Classes and placements during the midwifery programme will be in a variety of locations across London, and there is limited or no parking at these venues.

Placements maybe at a variety of Trusts – not all will be at a student's named Trust.

Although offered a choice of NHS Trust there can be no guarantee that students will get a place in their Trust of first choice.

Holidays for the midwifery programme are set for the 3 years and short course, are not negotiable and do not include 'half-terms'.

Midwifery involves providing personal care to a variety of patients, (both male and female) and students will be learning these skills while on placements.

It is understood that the full uniform policy of local Trusts must be adhered to when on practice placements.

I understand the expectations of being a student on a full time professional programme and will plan accordingly for this.

There is a Nursing and Midwifery Council requirement that any and all missed time (whether clinical or theoretical) has to be made up in order to complete the midwifery programme.

Punctuality is vital both in relation to class and clinical placement.

I understand that the course starts on **Monday 14th September 2026 and attendance during welcome weeks is compulsory.**
